RESOLUTION ON DISPOSAL AND DISPOSITION OF SIX MILE REGIONAL LIBRRY DISTRICT PROPERTY WITH A UNIT VALUE OF \$1,000 OR LESS

Whereas Illinois Statute addresses the disposal of public library district property (75ILCS 16/30-55.30) that states:

"The board may sell or otherwise dispose of real or personal property that it deems no longer necessary or useful for library purposes under terms the board deems best," and

Whereas Illinois Statute addresses the sale or disposition of public library district property (75ILCS 16/30-55.32) that states:

- "(a) When the board has determined to sell or otherwise dispose of real or personal property that it deems no longer useful or necessary for library purposes, the property may be sold or disposed of at a public sale as follows:
 - (1) Personal property of any value may be donated or sold to any other tax supported library or to any library system operating under the provisions of the Illinois Library System Act under terms or conditions determined by the board.
 - (2) Personal property having a unit value of \$1,000 or less may be disposed of as determined by the board.
 - (3) Personal property having a unit value of more than \$1,000 but less than \$2,500 may be displayed at the library and a public notice of its availability and the date and the terms of the proposed sale shall be posted." And

Whereas the board has hired a director to act as administrator of the district's daily operations; and

Whereas the board is interested in the efficient running of the district; now therefore be it

Resolved that the district director is authorized to:

- 1) determine when items with an unit value of \$1,000 or less are no longer useful or necessary for library purposes; and
- 2) determine the best path of disposal whether that is discarding; recycling; donating or selling the item(s) to any other tax supported library or library system; donating or selling the item(s) to others; and
 - 3) pursue the course of action that in his/her estimation is in the best interest of the district.
